

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT Craig Findlay

After the first 12 months of being Chairman, I would like to thank the previous Chairman and Board for leaving the association in a healthy state, that has made for a seamless transition. John Norton your four years as Chairman had set up the 2016 season to be prosperous, which it has been.

To Paula Shay as Vice Chair your support, dedication and initiatives around the business planning, recruitment and retention and building maintenance has been very much appreciated. A special mention to the subcommittee you chaired that updated our constitution. Your efforts in supporting our women's group are highly commendable.

VICE CHAIR'S REPORT Paula Shay

After being voted onto the board late last year (thank you for your support), my first step was to assist the board to bring about some planning to the year and document our achievements. I invited two facilitators to a Business Planning Session for the Board in January and we got a lot of ideas on paper to work on. A Steering Grid was also developed from the projects identified. This was reviewed at each Board meeting throughout the season and it gave us accountability on the things we needed to be focusing on, but also satisfaction at the end of the season when we can look back on everything we achieved; they are some of the things you will read about from the Board members.

Marketing Material / Recruitment

We had some late changes to the rules this year, so late that the Handbooks had already been printed. This meant that for the good of our umpires we needed to market the changes to each of the Clubs for clarity and understanding. With the assistance of AFL Central Vic, we issued posters to every club within our district and to all our field umpires.

Marketing material is key when getting people's attention. With the aid of some great images I made new brochures, posters and advertising for all types of media. This season our motto was about "Living the Game", being a part of it without playing. This material was used by Sharon and I in our recruitment drive through canvassing schools, athletics clubs and knowing most of our members come from connections to our members... you. We continued all season to bring attention where possible through Social Media and our page in the Footy Record.

Building Maintenance

We have great facilities at Weeroona Oval, thanks to Bendigo Council and the work of our clubs to continuously improve. We finished the season with what may be considered some small improvements but if anyone works with Council they know everything is a slow process when it requires approval and funding. Happily we can say we now have external electricity at our finger tips to all sides of the building, a new irrigation system on the field and the widening of the ground. The Weeroona Pavilion Advisory Committee is a small group, we meet quarterly and usually not for long but we have built a good relationship with all the User Groups and we look forward to that continuing.

Retention

To finish off the season I put together a survey which Sharon provided to all our members. Of all members who received it, 59 people completed the survey: 34 Field, 14 Goal and 11 Boundary.

All of the questions were optional so not all questions were answered by everyone.

This data has been reviewed by the Board and we would now like to share the findings with the group.


The Board, Coaches and the team will take these into account when planning next season for continuous improvement.

Overall I feel this is a positive response. There are key areas of improvement which great feedback to make our coaching even better.



We sought our members opinion on how approachable the team are, the response was generally positive and a great reminder for the Board, Coaches and Selectors that we are here for our members.

Please note 57% of responses are from Field Umpires, 23% Goal Umpires and 18% Boundary. Our key people: Sharon (GM), Dean (Coach), Craig and Gary (Field Selectors) have great response. That is not taking away from the Goal and Boundary team, but due to the lesser response number I feel the response is appropriate. I will take ideas to the Board to review and improve this for next season.





TREASURER'S REPORT Jason Seipolt

For the 2016 year, we made a small profit of \$709 (2015 loss: \$2,284). This was a good result considering our further commitment to the coaching structure. Cash has decreased by \$10,366 and a good majority of this decrease is in increased uniform stock on hand. We invested heavily toward the end of the year in relation to on field warm up shirts and off field jackets and shirts. Another factor was the continued late supply from the supplier which didn't help in moving this stock. The woes of our supplier have become quite public recently with their business going under. Fortuitously for us we were in the process of building a relationship with Loco Sportswear (Gary March and Ken Sheldon) and whilst we were looking to produce training shirts through this supplier we will now be committing wholeheartedly. We need to ensure that we get as close a match as possible to our existing uniform so that our current stock does not become obsolete.

We had receivables owing of \$3,288 as at 31st October 2016, all are paid except for the Loddon Valley Football League that advised that their accounts were closed for 2016. I am yet to present the invoice to the Bendigo Junior Football League (BJFL) as this was an invoice to apportion the costs of the BJFLUG. The BJFL have had issues procuring the sponsorship from the major sponsor. When this happens, I hope to issue the invoice.

We have just signed a contract with AFL Central Vic which increases our commitment to the Central Administration Hub in 2017. We need to commit to some further initiatives to drive more income into the Association. We need to develop and drive a second-tier sponsorship program and work hard on things like the Toyota Good for footy raffle and ensure we make the most of these opportunities. Next year will be another test of our reserves. We are reluctant to further increase our take on umpire's fees, but this will become a reality if we cannot drive further income through the door. If it is not increased income, then it must be a reduction of the services we provide to our umpires. That is the reality of the situation, something eventually must give.

I would like to thank my fellow board members for their tireless work in 2016. It is a tough gig and the small business we run seems to be getting larger and more complex every year. I would like to thank my wife and family for allowing me the time to devote to my role during 2016. I look forward to 2017 with excitement as we progress our development even further.

FUTURE FOOTBALLS PATHWAY Mark Lennox

Project Background and Rationale:

In 2013 and 2014 AFL Central Victoria undertook consultations to develop a strategic plan for football in Central Victoria.

During that consultation and during other meetings with clubs throughout 2014, the commission received feedback from a number of clubs that the need to review league and junior structures is vitally important to ensure the viability of clubs in Central Victoria.

Project Scope:

The 2016/2017 Football Review – Central Victoria was commissioned to establish qualitative and quantitative data to form the basis on which recommendations for the optimal structure of football and netball competitions in Central Victoria for season 2018 and beyond.

The Football Futures group appointed by AFL Central Victoria was established in April 2016 and is planned to meet monthly to manage the review with scope that shall extend to interviews, consultations and subsequent recommendations with all stakeholders.

Following the completion of the consultations and analysis of the data obtained, preliminary recommendations will be established and presented to the various stakeholders for feedback.

Final recommendations will then be established for consideration of AFL Central Victorian Commission. It is envisaged that there will be short term (2017), medium term (2018) and long term (2019+) recommendations made.

The Football Futures group is made up of AFL Central Victorian Commissioners, representatives from each of the Leagues including Umpires and Netball, AFL Central Victorian staff and with the chairperson being the AFL Central Victorian Region General Manager.

Responsibilities of the working group:

- Initially, conduct a start up to establish roles and responsibilities of the members, preparation of a purpose statement and the determination of information required to enable members to achieve the purpose statement
- > To consult extensively with key stakeholders and
- > To consider all influences, both positive and negative, on the leagues and its affiliated clubs to make informed recommendations including;
 - Club viability
 - Player access and numbers
 - Volunteerism
 - Finances
 - Other matters deemed appropriate

Review Points:

- ✓ Club sustainability
- Maximise participation for both males and females in Australian Football & Netball
- ✓ Removing the barriers to integrated pathway & alignment for junior football and netball competitions
- ✓ To ensure participation levels in junior structure increase and clubs are sustainable into the future
- ✓ Standardisation of age groups
- ✓ Assistance and development of strong volunteer bases in clubs
- ✓ Healthy and sustainable communities and clubs that support each other
- ✓ Adaptability to cater for changing micro and macro environment and changing demographics
- ✓ Balance competition results, management of country v city, balance of age of participants in underage competitions
- ✓ Club education of how to change/look forward and how to use the skill base and
- ✓ Any other items that arise from discussions with affiliated clubs that will have an impact on the future of football and/or netball in Central Victoria.

It is planned at this stage to develop a detailed model and draft recommendations to be presented to the AFLCV and distributed to all affected stakeholders by end of 2016 with final recommendations to be distributed by end of March 2017.

> Independent audit and correct financial processes adhered to

The Bendigo Umpires Association Board meet bi monthly and a full disclosure of all financials are reported. Budgets versus actuals are discussed with analysis on differences explored, allowing greater insight into actual spending and budgeting going forward.

An independent audit is conducted every financial year and our figures lodged with Consumer Affairs Victoria on time and within their guidelines.

Sponsorship & Fundraising

What has been done to attract and service new and existing sponsors

The Bendigo Umpires Association has maintained four major sponsors in Season 2016.

- The Bendigo Bank
- The Inglewood and District Community Bank
- The Borough Club/Bendigo Stadium

Season 2016 has seen Golden City Physiotherapy come on board as a sponsor. It was established that with the size of our umpiring group, we required the services of medical team. Golden City Physiotherapy were approached and could see the benefit to their business in having the BUA on board. Part of this sponsorship is for Golden City Physiotherapy to oversee the medical treatment for all umpires. This has been important addition, adding a medical team/base. They are now the first point of call when an umpire receives any type of injury for assessment and ongoing treatment.

Part of servicing sponsors Eye Care Plus and Golden City Physiotherapy is feet through the door. We encourage all umpires and their families to visit Mark Prince to have their eye health checkups. Golden City Physiotherapy have noted that they now have many families and friends of BUA umpires also attending their clinic for physiotherapy services. We have also encouraged both sponsors to attend training sessions and spend time with our umpires. Both groups have said that this increases visitations.












We actively promote all sponsors via our website and the AFL Central Victoria website. All documentation distributed via the AFL Central Victoria website and social media displays sponsors logos.







We have continued with the reciprocal sponsorship of the Bendigo Braves Basketball via a player sponsorship program. This has once again provided positive advertising for the group at weekly Braves games. This not only allows our members a chance to enjoy the corporate hospitality at the Bendigo Braves games, but it also has built up a relationship with the Braves team and on two occasions in season 2016 both groups enjoy a training session together at the Bendigo Stadium.

Demonstration of active social program within the Umpiring Group

The BUA offers all members a variety of social activities through the running season. These activities include:

- Monthly Thursday night dinners after training, including BBQ's, pizza nights, hot dogs and pie nights.
- Milestone Dinner.
- What's Your Decision Night Guest speaker Stephen "Jack" McBurney.
- Casserole Night.

- Trivia Night.
- Ten Pin Bowling night and team activity.
- Lady Umpire Brunch
- Annual Dinner and Awards Night. Guest speaker Past Umpire and Nike Executive George Lawlor.
- Family Day and bare foot lawn bowls.

Umpires and their families support the various social activities in good numbers, with the Annual Dinner being our major event each year with around 200 people in attendance.

> Identification of income streams

The BUA Board have identified that the major income stream is to fulfill as many appointments as possible across the four leagues that we contract for. In 2016 we have slightly increased our margin and now take 18% from all appointments, this enables us to maintain the high level coaching structure that we offer.

In season 2016 we took advantage of and participated in the "Good for Football Raffle". This was not in our budget forecast, but proved to be a very successful fundraiser for the BUA.

Membership

Efforts in attracting members

The BUA offers all umpires an introduction bonus, when a new umpire joins the BUA and umpires 10 games in that season, the umpire who refers that person receives a \$100.00 bonus at the end of the season. In Season 2016 we will pay out 20 bonus payments. We have found this method to be very successful in attracting and maintaining quality umpires.

Another way in which the introduction bonus works, is that we have a lot of families that are now umpiring together. As an example Bailey Baxter joined the BUA as a Boundary umpire and a year later encouraged his Dad Scott Baxter to join, they are both now proficient umpires going into their 3rd and 4th years. We have now have three members of the Floyd family umpiring. One family member brings along their Brother/Sister or Dad and they receive the bonus. We even have one Granddad who now has his Grand Daughter goal umpiring and is keen to try boundary umpiring in Season 2017.





As a long term project we have joined forces with the Bendigo Junior Football League and created the BFJL Umpiring Group at Under 12 level.

- BJFL Under 12's has 32 teams.
- Our aim is to ensure safety for all competitors.
- Provide training for parents and carers to ensure umpiring is of a higher standard.
- Using this as a recruitment tool for the future. We hope that these parents and carers go onto umpire with their children at Under 14 and Under 16 level.
- Compulsory registration of 2 plus parents or carers.
- Providing an umpiring uniform, has made the umpires more identifiable and created a higher respect from players.


We ran two training sessions out of Weeroona Oval with Rod Threlfall – AFL Victoria and Dean Goodridge - Director of Coaching BUA. BJFL Umpiring Group participants were taken through the following:

- Attributes of a good umpire
- Importance of communication
- Contest for the ball key questions regarding holding the ball/holding the man
- Prior opportunity, legal tackle, disposing the ball legally
- Positioning aim to be 20 metres from play, side on to play
- Change of control

Dean Goodridge also travelled to Kyneton and ran a session for the parents and carers from Clubs Kyneton, Gisborne and Castlemaine.









We see this group as a future recruiting tool. Our hope is that parents enjoy being a part of their child's sport, that they understand the importance of umpires to the game and want to stay involved. We look forward to 2017 to see how our recruiting worked and what we can learn from season 1 of BJFL Umpiring Group.

We applied for and received the following two grants for this pilot program and which we hope going forward can keep growing.

- Sport Club Grants Program: Category 1 Uniforms or Equipment
- Sporting Club Grants Program: Category 2 Skill Development



The BJFL Umpiring Group received its own sponsorship from Jumpz Trampolines and as a recruiting tool, it has fully funded itself.

During the last 4 to 5 games of the season, we ran some of the members from this group with a Senior Umpire as a mentor at Under 14 and Under 16 level. This was to establish the level at which these members were at, but to also ensure that we had an abundance of umpires going into finals.

With the support of our sponsor and the Government funding, this group will go into its second year in Season 2017. We have established that many of the BJFL Umpires will umpire with the BUA in Season 2017.

Retention Strategy/Activities

Membership at the BUA kept steady in Season 2016.

- Field umpire numbers were at the highest level for many seasons. We believe this is due to the Coaching structure now offered by the BUA. The return of retired senior umpires also assisted with Field umpire numbers.
- Boundary umpire numbers increased as the season progressed and the standard and quality of boundaries umpires was at an all-time high level. Working closely with Sandhurst Football Club increased boundary umpire numbers, with many of their players coming on board in season 2016.
- Goal umpire levels stayed steady.

We were able to increase umpire numbers throughout the North Central region with the establishment of a training group out of Charlton. The NCFL is our most critical area going forward, so with the assistance of Lance Standfield — General Manager of the NCFL we talent identified individuals. Through this we were able to retain the services of some past umpires.

We also met with the NCFL Board and asked that each Club nominate two or three boundary umpires to register with the BUA and umpire games throughout the season. We had moderate success with this strategy. Our aim is to put these boundary umpires through a mentoring program and increase the numbers of field umpires going forward.



- We believe that we really have it all.

- We are well supported by the North Central Football League and AFL Central Victoria.




The Loddon Valley umpiring group also maintained its numbers and welcomed in new members.

The figures that came from this survey were certainly favorable with regards to retention of umpires in Season 2017.

Adding to our current coaching structure with further physical education staff going forward and more specialized people in each field is assisting with retaining and attracting quality umpires to our group.

Services provided to members

The Bendigo Umpires Association offers to all members a well structured coaching group that has experienced individuals in charge of each discipline that are committed to the task of ensuring we provide the best umpires on the field each weekend.

Director of Coaching Dean Goodridge oversees two boundary coaches, two goal umpire coaches and a fitness advisor. We have a team of 5 Observers who travel throughout Central Victoria to watch umpires and provide feedback to coaching staff, Chairman of Selectors and umpires.

Being officiated with the AFL Central Victoria Commission ensures that we have a strong presence in football throughout the region. Board Member Mark Lennox represents the BUA on the Football Futures Pathway group that reports directly to the AFL Central Victoria Commissioners.

We have continued to provide a massage service where we have contracted a Physiotherapist to assist our members on a weekly basis in their preparation for matches. During season 2016 finals she attended all games at the QEO to provide medical services for our umpires.

Our on-line services have increased, with members able to access required information on appointments, availability and social information via our website, our team app and our Facebook page. This is updated constantly and allows up to date information to all umpires.

Initiatives to attract Females and people from Diverse backgrounds



We started off the season with a photo in the Bendigo Advertiser, this was a great example of the umpires we have at the BUA, we have the diversity in our Indian umpires, who are in Australia working at the Bendigo Bank, and have come on board with the BUA and love umpiring. Then Scott Baxter represented past footballers who now umpire our game. Noel Ridge is a second year goal umpire (70 years in age), Mark Snell previously a football coach and then Mikayla Ford one of our female goal umpires, who came to the BUA with her Dad and last Liam Brown 16 years old and brother of James Brown who is now umpiring VFL, a boundary umpire.

We identified in season 2015 that our female umpires came to the BUA as daughters and sisters of umpires. We have been able to maintain all of the females and added to the group with a grand daughter and a niece.

All of our advertising very clearly identifies females and this will be our strategy going forward.

Facebook works extremely well as a communication mediator. Our members join a closed group that provides daily updates on training, social activities, notifications for umpires.






Season 2016


There are also those who have excelled and the BUA is excited to announce two of our members have been accepted onto the VFL Development Squad. This is the first time we have had unight make the VFL congratibitions to 16 yz old John Varfer. We also send our best wishes to James Brown our leading boundary umpire. We already have several umpires in both boundary and field at the VFL and a boundary running in the AFL; the BUA are very proud of their achievements

Welcome everyone to the 2016 season and we start the year with changes to the rules! The BUA endorses these rules, not only for player safety, but we can see how the AFL is trying to encourage a faster more free flowing game.

Increasing the Protected Area:
Last year, no one was allowed within five metres of the person with the ball after a mark or free kick. This year the protected area is extended to 10 metres, if a player goes in that protected zone, expect a 50 metre penalty to be awarded. Note: the 10 metres does not apply behind the player but arches around from 5 metres behind. A player from the opposing team may still accompany or follow within 2 metres of their opponent.



Line of the Man on the Mark: instead of the man on the mark being able to line their backs up with the middle of the goals and to creep around in an arch to deeply someone from playing on, they will have to line themselves up parallel with the centre square "EastiViest". Should the player with the ball choose to move off the mark this will still cause the umpire to call "Play On".



The BUA is excited to be umpling on a new ground this year with the introduction of See Lake to the North Central Football Netball League. This also increases the games being umplied each week screas the region and with that the need for more goal and boundary umplies. Goal umplie coach Kevin Mank and boundary selector Andrew Day are welcoming anyone who may be interested in starting a new sport with a great team.

For teenagers of the region it's a great way to make money and stay fit and for those of us who have our income secured, it's great bonus to the friends and social interaction of a big

Implementation of a Codes of Conduct

The Bendigo Umpire Association Board will keep our Code of Conduct updated to ensure that is kept current. Our Board has a strong background with Paula Shay and Mark Lennox both having backgrounds with the updating of Constitutions and Codes of Conduct for associations.

AFL Central Victorian Commissioner and qualified lawyer Greg Westbrook will oversee this to make sure we meet the current legislation.

Currently, all members tick a box on their registration form that they have read and agree to our code of conduct when they sign up each year.

Our Code of Conduct is made public on our website.



Active support of volunteer members at the Group

We have financed for volunteer members of our group to complete their RSA, we also pay an honorarium for a suitably qualified member to administer and manage our Green Shirt program.

Good governance practices e.g. an active committee with defined tasks and roles

In Season 2016 Board Member Paula Shay, set up a subcommittee who oversaw the updating of the BUA Constitution. On Thursday 26th May 2016 a special resolution was proposed and passed that amendments to the Consumer Affairs Model Rules to incorporate the requirements of the Bendigo Umpires Association.

Our Board have continued to adhere to our Model Rules. The Board meets bi-monthly and board members submit reports covering their port folios prior to all meetings.

The Bendigo Umpire Association Board members having the following port folios:

Each of these members has a level of expertise associated with their portfolio. All Board members are very active, supportive and contributing members.

Management Strategy for the growth and development of the Group

Every Thursday night we have compulsory theory education sessions using local vision that our Director of Coaching presents to help umpires improve their performance. Our Boundary Coaching Team and Goal Umpire Coaching Team now also have compulsory education sessions weekly.

Director of Coaching has travelled to the NCFL Umpiring Group and the LVFNL Umpiring Group to complete coaching sessions. This is to ensure that these umpires are up to date with their coach and accreditation.

Our coaching team attend AFL accreditation courses and keep up to date with all rule changes.

New umpires to the BUA are appointed with a buddy/mentor. They are provided with one on one training and coaching. Observation reports are used to monitor their progress.

Green shirt programs have once again been run through this season, with around 6 of our boundary umpires, umpiring games as a Field umpire in Season 2016.

Development

Active implementation of AFL Umpire Development and Coaching Programs

Coach professional development program was attended by BUA coaching staff in season 2016. All current coaches have their up to date accreditation.

Fitness Advisor, match day observers and Boundary umpires coach are actively involved in delivering feedback and skills sessions.

Along with Director of Coaching Dean Goodridge our Coaches Andrew Barker, Geoffrey Annand and Noel Ridge all completed the Development Umpire Coach in Season 2016.

National Umpire Accreditation Scheme

We have registered 69 members for accreditation and reaccreditation in 2016.

Working closely with Russell O'Toole this system ran quite smoothly and with a little encouragement to some umpires we managed to get these finalized.
